



## RCFP INSTITUTE PRESENTS "YOSEMITE SAM" AWARD TO STATE FIRE MARSHAL ED PAULK



#### SHERRY GARNER MEMORIAL AWARD

She hit the ground running and has not stopped since the day she joined Appleton Volunteer Fire Department in Escambia County.

**Helen Jackson** was honored as the 2011 Female Firefighter of the Year when she received the Sherry Garner Memorial Award at the 34th Annual AAVFD Conference in Point Clear. This award is named for the first female firefighter in Alabama who died in the line of duty in 1981.

Helen's desire is making sure all responses are successful, and all equipment and manpower are prepared for the next call. She is always the last firefighter to leave after an incident making sure used equipment is replaced, hoses are cleaned and pumpers are filled.

To date in 2011, Helen has responded to 146 calls. Observing the need for training during these responses has given her incentive to complete 174 hours of training in the last twelve months, including CPR & AED, First Responder, Mobile Fire Suppression, Mass Casualty Incident Triage, Closed POD Training, 40-hour Certified Fire Inspector 1, Emergency Vehicle Operator and is currently attending the Certified 160-Volunteer Firefighter Course maintaining a 90 average.

There is so much more to operating a department than answering calls and training. Appleton VFD, like all other volunteer fire departments, has a business side that must be maintained in order to function on an efficient level. Helen has completed hose tests, hydrant tests, equipment invento-

ries, and equipment inspections.

Helen is a valuable asset during fund-raising events for the department, especially the last event. She was able to obtain a donation for most of the food helping Appleton VFD raise over \$1,500.

Helen Jackson is a dedicated individual who participates in everything it takes to serve her department and community and has gained the respect of many firefighters in the county, as well as Appleton firefighters.

#### **REMEMBERING 9-11 IN FRISCO CITY**

Local firefighters, law enforcement, other first responders and citizens spent hours Sunday night commemorating those lost in the September 11, 2001 terrorist attacks 10 years ago in New York, Washington, D.C. and the fourth jet that crashed in Shanksville, Pa.

Local elected officials, including Frisco City Mayor Sue Starr and Probate Judge Greg Norris, and special guest Monroeville Police Chief Investigator Sgt. Omer West. AAVFD President Chauncey Wood and Chuck Murph representing Alabama Department of Homeland Security spoke on the heroism of the fallen at the 9/11 Memorial Service.

The American Legion/VFW Honor Guard presented the nation's colors and fired a 21- gun salute. Mrs. Susan Ward and Mr. Jason White provided music for the 9/11 Memorial Service. AAVFD Honor Guard Captain Hugh Harris tolled the bell for the 9-11 Heroes. Alabama Forestry Commission's Blaze the Arson Dog provided the K-9 Walk.

About 150 visitors across the state participated in the 9/11 Memorial Service Candlelight Vigil remembering all those

lost in the Sept. 11, 2001 terror attacks.

#### **LUVERNE SHELLING BUILDING BURNS**


A demolition project at Luverne Co-op Services led to one of the largest working fires in the past 30 years for the Luverne VFD. Thursday August 25th was a near 100 degree clear summer day. A demolition crew had demolished approximately one half of a 3.5 story 100 X 84 foot peanut shelling building. The original building was built in the 1940s. Most of the metal exterior walls had been removed. This left the heart pine structural wood and walls exposed. The original building was built with a sprinkler system. Workers were using cutting torches to cut the old metal sprinkler pipes.

Workers left for lunch and returned around 1:30 PM. The workers found a small fire and attempted to extinguish the fire with water and fire extinguishers. According to a witness, the fire got ugly real fast. The witness called the Luverne Police Dept at 1:45 PM. An employee of the Coop called Crenshaw Central E-911. The employee reported the old shelling building was fully involved. LVFD responded within four minutes. The fire arriving LVFD officer immediately called for mutual aid. The Co-op is only 7 blocks due north of LVFD station. This writer was on the first engine out. Heavy smoke and fire was visible.

LVFD immediately went to a surround and drown attack. The radiant heat made approaching the fire nearly impossible. LVFD was fortunate that the City of Luverne Electric Dept had crews nearby and immediately cut the power to the grid. The photographs show that the fire had already extended to the utility poles beside the building. The structure collapsed approximately within ten minutes of the first

units arriving.

LVFD received assistance from Rutledge, Glenwood, Fullers X Roads, and Brantley VFDs. A total of 24 fire fighters fought the fire in extreme heat conditions. A Luverne Rescue squad unit brought additional water supplies to the scene. Fire fighters were constantly monitored while fighting fire in the near 100 degree heat.

LVFD was successful in protecting exposures. Those exposures included a LP gas tank, two warehouses used to store fertilizers, two liquid feed tanks, and the actual Co-op store.


