Nominations from the floor at the annual meeting are permitted by the AAVFD by-laws. All candidates, except those presented by the nominating committee, must be present at the annual business meeting.

All six officers are elected by majority vote of the members in attendance and those members represented by proxy.

Each District (1 through 10) will elect two individuals to represent their district on the Board of Directors for the coming year. AAVFD by-laws require that those two individuals shall not be from the same member department and, in so far as possible, shall come from different geographical areas within the district. Directors and Alternate Directors shall be elected by a committee consisting of one individual from each dues-paid general member department from within the district (ONE VOTE PER DEPARTMENT PRESENT) at the general meeting.

An organizational meeting was held May 20, 1977 at the Holiday Inn in Montgomery to organize The Alabama Firefighters Association. The office opened on June 20, 1995 some eighteen years later with Sandra Mott working two, three and then four days a week part-time. On May 11, 1996 AAVFD Board of Directors hired Sandra Mott full time. After 19 years AAVFD finally had its first and only paid employee! Sixteen years later, on April 1, 2012 Sandra Mott retired. Sandra has been the "voice" for **OUR** Association, fire service "watch dawg", editor of **OUR** newsletter "The Volunteer", office manager, executive assistant to the president, and the list goes on and on!! Sandra Mott is well respected by not only **OUR** AAVFD family but all who know her across the State of Alabama. Sandra, we will miss you of course, but truly pray for the best in your retirement. "The Volunteer" is dedicated to you- you earned it- you deserve it! Enjoy your retirement and come see us from time to time.

The Regular Session and First Special Session of The Alabama Legislature are now complete. However, there is at least one more "storm cloud" to deal with, namely the General Fund. A Constitutional Amendment that must be voted on by the citizens of Alabama on Tuesday, September 18th. Should this Constitutional Amendment not pass, the entire budget will collapse and throw the General Fund budget into a crisis. This will affect **OUR** line item Rural Community Fire Protection Legislative (Forestry) FY 2013 grant checks for October 1, 2012 and June 1, 2013. It took a lot of persistence and diligence by several talented people to complete OUR Legislative Agenda. I extend a big "Thank You" to everyone who helped with AAVFD Legislation. Special thanks to Mike Green, Jimmy Looney, Ed Paulk, Roy Mott, Scott Pilgreen, Sandra Mott (1st half of Session) and Whitney McClelland (2nd half of Session) for walking the halls, attending committee meetings and public hearings. I was able to witness their fortitude first hand and my compliments to each of them for their dedication, devotion and hard work for the entire fire service. OUR direct involvement from the local level was definitely the key to **OUR** success here in Montgomery and I appreciate members of the Joint Fire Council; Steve Pegues, Mark Threadgill and Randy Childs working collectively for fire service legislation with us. AAVFD Legislation 2013 is being drafted and three bills are ready for pre-filing for a February 5th beginning. (See AAVFD 2012 Legislation Final Report in this issue.)

"He signed it!" Yes, Governor Robert J. Bentley signed into Law SB 134 sponsored by Senator Gerald Allen (HB334 by Representative John Merrill). AAVFD will now have an appointment to the Firefighter's Personnel Standards Commission for the first time ever! Alabama Firefighter's Association and Professional Firefighter's Association of Alabama already have an appointment. The seat that will be filled by one of **OUR** own comes up in July 2014.

It's hard to believe that <u>OUR</u> 35th Annual Conference is just around the corner. Seems like just yesterday we were all down at Point Clear at The Grand Hotel. This year's conference is being hosted by AAVFD and District III. Conference Chair Billy Doss, Co-chairs Belinda Lancaster, Larry Jarvis, Scott Hallman, along with their Conference Committee have been working tirelessly to make OUR stay both enjoyable and memorable!

Competition is always at its best under the direction of Joey Boyd, Of course, we all know that Joey couldn't do what he does if it were not for his beautiful bride Sandy and daughter Carma (who by the way is following in their footsteps as an EMT!) Oh yeah, I almost forgot, the driving force behind competition, Paige Crouch! We had four teams at Fire Fighters Appreciation Day in Tuscaloosa, so come on teams lets go for break-eight or ten-how about it?

#### 2012 AAVFD LEGISLATION

Chauncey D. Wood III - AAVFD President

HB1/SB9 - WORKERS' COMPENSATION INSURANCE- Rep. Richard Laird - Senator Gerald Dial- Would require the Commissioner of Insurance to regulate the maximum annual payroll per fire fighter or rescue squad member for the purpose of setting workers' compensation rates for volunteer fire departments of rescue squads, or combination departments. History- Passed in the House-failed in the Senate. Prefiled for February 2013 Legislative Session.

HB5 - STATE FIREFIGHTER DEATH BENEFIT EXPANDING- Rep. Mike Jones- Provide death and disability benefits due to certain occupational diseases for firefighters employed by the state; and to provide that the state must prove by a preponderance of the evidence that the condition was caused by some means other than the occupation disqualify the fire firefighter from benefits. EFFECTIVE: AUGUST 1, 2012 HISTORY- Signed by Governor Robert Bentley on May 2, 2012. Act # 2012-559

HB11 - HEALTH INSURANCE FOR LODD SURVIVING SPOUSE/DEPENDENTS- Rep. Kurt Wallace- Would allow surviving spouse or dependants to continue to be covered by the SEHIB plan and the cost would be paid from the State Treasury. EFFECTIVE: AUGUST 1, 2012 HISTORY- Signed by Governor Robert Bentley on May 22, 2012. Act # 2012-498

HB89 - STATEWIDE E-911 BOARD- Rep. Mike Millican- Would replace existing Commercial Mobile Radio Service Board, provide for establishing and collecting a single statewide emergency telephone service charge replacing all existing charges, and provide for the distribution of funds to local communications districts and commercial mobile radio service providers. EFFECTIVE: Sections 11-98-4.1, 11-98-5.2, 11-98-13.1, 11-98-14, and 11-98-15, Code of Alabama 1975, shall become effective immediately, May 8, 2012; following the passage and approval of this act by the Governor, or its otherwise becoming law. Section 11-98-5.3, Code of Alabama 1975, shall become effective on the first day of the fourth month, September 1, 2012; following the passage and approval of this act by the Governor, or its otherwise becoming law. The remaining provisions of this act shall become effective October 1, 2013. HISTORY- Signed by Governor Robert Bentley on May 8, 2012. Act# 2012-293.

HB185 - TAX EXEMPTION- Rep. Richard Laird- Provide sales tax exemption AAVFD and County Volunteer Fire Associations, AL Association of Rescue Squads, County Rescue Squads and Fire Districts that do not come under the auspices of their County Commission. EFFECTIVE: AUGUST 1, 2012 HISTORY- Signed by Governor Robert Bentley on May 22, 2012. Act # 2012-544

HB186/SB326 - PROVIDE FOR AL FORESTRY COMMISSION LOANED EQUIPMENT DISPOSAL BY VOL-UNTEER FIRE DEPARTMENTS- Rep. Richard Laird- Amend Section 9-3-18 to allow a fire department to dispose of state-owned property obtained through the AL Forestry Commission in any manner it chooses. EFFECTIVE: AUGUST 1, 2012 HISTORY- Signed by Governor Robert Bentley on May 23, 2012. Act # 2012-555

HB187 - RESCUE SQUAD- Rep. Richard Laird- Allow minimum voluntary \$2 income tax contribution by check off on annual income tax returns. EFFECTIVE: AUGUST 1, 2012 HISTORY- Signed by Governor Robert Bentley on May 22, 2012. Act # 2012-543

HB233 - ALABAMA FORESTRY COMMISSION- Rep. Chad Fincher - Amend Section 9-3-9, Code of Alabama 1975, to provide for criminal penalties for violation of certain rules pertaining to conduct of persons on land designated as a state forest. HISTORY- Passed in the House/ Senate, carried over to call of the chair- Failed last day, May 16, 2012.

HB275 - AL FIREFIGHTERS ANNUITY AND BENEFIT FUND- Rep. Richard Laird- Constitutional amendment to levy additional one-half mill annual state ad valorem tax to be distributed evenly between AL Firefighters Annuity Fund and AL Peace Offices Annuity Fund. HISTORY- Passed House Ways & Means General Fund- Failed in the House. Prefiled for February 2013 Legislative Session.

HB318 - ALABAMA FORESTRY COMMISSION: Rep. Charles Newton- Would specify that the removal of timber or forest products by deception would be unlawful punished by a Class A misdemeanor. EFFECTIVE: AUGUST 1, 2012 HISTORY- Signed by Governor Robert Bentley on May 15, 2012, Act # 2012-428

HB366 - LINE OF DUTY DISEASES- Rep. Allen Treadway- Would authorize blood and saliva testing of any person who exposes a law enforcement officer, firefighter, first responder, or corrections officer to a contagious, infectious, and communicable disease during the course and scope of the law enforcement officer's official duties. HISTORY- Passed in the House- Favorable from Senate Finance & Taxation Education Committee on May 9, 2012- Failed to come up on last day, May 16, 2012.

HB316/SB336 - SPRINKLER SYSTEM PERMITS- Rep. Randy Wood- Senator Bryan Taylor- Allow State Fire Marshal to issue permits to certified potable water single family dwelling fire protection sprinkler contractors. HISTORY-Passed in the Senate; on Special Order Calendar in the House 3 times, failed to come up on the House Special Order Calendar on the last day, May 16, 2012. Prefiled for February 2013 Legislative Session

HB334/SB134 - ESTABLISH ALABAMA FIRE COLLEGE INDEPENDENT STATUS: Rep. John Merrill- Sen. Gerald Allen- Clarify that the Fire College is an independent institution of postsecondary education under the Personnel Standards Commission. Also provides for representation of AAVFD and AL Association of Fire Chiefs on the Commission. EFFECTIVE IMMEDIATELY APRIL 17, 2012. HISTORY- Signed by Governor Robert Bentley on April 17, 2012.

#### **AAVFD LOCAL LEGISLATION**

Pike County- HB624- Rep Alan Boothe- Pike Co., Ad Valorem tax, county commission authorized to levy additional outside corporate limits of Troy and Brundidge distribution, referendum for volunteer fire departments. HISTORY-Passed in the House, Failed in the Senate.

#### AAVFD SUPPORTED LEGISLATION

SB443- Sen. Roger Bedford- To require recreational trailers be constructed in compliance with American National Standards Inst., approved by State Fire Marshall. EFFECTIVE IMMEDIATLEY May 23, 2012. History- Signed by Governor Robert Bentley on May 23, 2012. Act # 2012-566

HB436- Rep. Bill Poole- Sales tax holiday for emergency preparedness supplies- This law created an additional sales tax holiday weekend for emergency preparedness supplies. For 2012, the holiday will be the first full weekend in July. In following years, the holiday will be the last full weekend of February. Counties have the option to participate. Counties wishing to participate in this year's holiday have until June 22 to adopt a resolution agreeing to participate. Without such a resolution, the county sales tax will be collected on all purchases. EFFECTIVE IMMEDIATLEY- APRIL 26, 2012. HISTO-RY- Signed by Governor Robert Bentley on April 26, 2012. Act # 2012-256

**SB136- Sen. Paul Bussman-**Storm shelters- This law excludes certain prefabricated storm shelters from regulation by the Alabama Manufactured Housing Commission. It also requires storm shelter manufacturers to post a \$20,000 surety bond with the Alabama Emergency Management Agency (AEMA). AEMA is also given oversight over all storm shelters, both community and residential. This oversight includes authority to perform random inspections. **EFFECTIVE IMMEDIAT-LEY- APRIL 24, 2012. HISTORY- Signed by Governor Robert Bentley on April 26, 2012. Act # 2012-224** 

**SB208- Sen. Arthur Orr-** Controlled substances, Schedule I, cathinone compounds, synthetic cannabinoid, controlled analog substances, included and subject to regulation and penalties, penalties for trafficking in controlled analog substances, Sec. 13A-12-214.1, 13A-12-231, 20-2-23, am'd (2012-20047). **EFFECTIVE MAY 10, 2012- Signed by Governor Robert Bentley on April 30, 2012. Act# 2012-267**.



# RURAL LEE COUNTY RESIDENTS APPROVE FIRE FEE INCREASE

It wasn't even close. Residents in rural Lee County approved a proposal increasing the \$25 fire fee to \$50 and renewing it for 25 more years 1,799 votes to 238 Tuesday.

"The real benefit of the fire fee is to the citizens," said John McCracken Jr., chairman Lee County Firefighter's Association. "What this means is that we can keep doing what are doing for the citizens."

McCracken said the citizens will continue to get fire, medical and rescue services in the unincorporated areas of the county at least another 25 years.

"They actually voted for themselves today, rather than us," he said. "We are just the ones doing the job."

Including absentee votes, 2,037 residents cast ballots at 16 polling places:

- Smiths Station Volunteer Fire Department (formerly known as Friendship Volunteer Fire Department), Fire District No. 1: For 653, Against 122;
- Beauregard Volunteer Fire Department, Fire District No. 2: For 521, Against 39;
- Plainview Volunteer Fire Department, Fire District No.
  4: For 6, Against 0;
- Salem Volunteer Fire Department, Fire District No. 5: For 245, Against 37;
- Southwest Lee County Fire Protection Authority, Fire District No. 7: For 248, Against 30; and

District 10 – Montgomery County

• Farmville Volunteer Fire Department, Fire District No. 8: For 126, Against 10;

The fire fee, which is payable to the Lee County Revenue Commissioner at the same time property taxes are collected, is due Oct. 1, and delinquent if not paid before Jan. 1, 2013.

Beauregard Volunteer Fire Department Board Chairman Rusty Sowell said the increase will enable the board to go forward with its long-range three- to five-year plans.

"We plan to build another station down toward U.S. Highway 80, which will put everybody in our community within a five-mile radius of a station," Sowell said. "We will be able to upgrade our equipment."



# PIKE ROAD FIRE DEPARTMENT PUTTING YOUR TAX DOLLARS BACK IN YOUR POCKETS

The Pike Road Volunteer Fire Department recently took delivery of a new service/rescue apparatus. The new truck is a 2012 Ford F 550 four wheel drive chassis with an eight and a half foot by twelve foot aluminum body box. The truck was built by Sunbelt Fire in Fairhope, Alabama specifically for the Pike Road Fire Department. Several months were spent designing the new Dual-Purpose truck which will replace two older vehicles that have been in service for many years. The primary function of the truck will be to carry various equipment used at fire scenes. Insurance Services Organization or I.S.O., gives Fire Departments extra credit if they have a fully equipped "service" vehicle in their fleet. This in turn helps us lower our I.S.O. rating, which directly affects most of your insurance premiums. Items such as additional air packs, axes, lights and ladders, among a host of other tools and equipment, will be carried to the fire scene via this vehicle.

In addition to the "service truck" designation mentioned above, the new truck will also serve the Department as a fully functional Rescue Unit. It is equipped with an onboard 5kw generator to supply scene lighting and run various electrical rescue tools. It also has an extrication (jaws-of-life) unit with various tools for pushing, pulling, prying and cutting. These extrication tools assist in removal of trapped victims, not only in vehicle accidents, but from many other types of accidents also.

#### **URIAH VFD CELEBRATES ANNIVERSARY**

Local and state emergency personnel were on hand as Uriah Volunteer Fire Department members celebrated the 50th anniversary of the agency's founding and a piece of steel recovered from the World Trade Center following the Sept. 11, 2001 terrorist attacks was on display.

The event Saturday morning was held at the station just south of the intersection of Alabama highways 21 and 59 with several dozen people in attendance, and Chief Eddie Snow announced plans to construct a second station south of Uriah on Hwy. 59. He said the new station means all residents served by the department will be within five miles of a station.

He said after the station is built he will request a new ISO inspection for a possible new rating below their already good Class 6, which will benefit homeowners with their insurance costs.

The department was formed in 1962 when the water system was established, and O.T. Bradford was the first chief, serving until 1980 when Art Elliott was named chief.

Elliott was on hand, and Snow presented him with plaque naming him as honorary lifetime chief.

Charles Murphy was chief in 1990, and Roger Jay held the post in 1991 and 1992. Snow served from 1993 to 1999, and Robert Smith was chief from 1999-2003. Snow took over again in 2003 and has served since.

Snow outlined the major events in the department's history, including the construction of the current station in 1991 and the bank note burning on the building just five years later, the addition of an EMT first responder team in 1993 and the Jaws of Life team in 1998.

"It's been a very busy 50 years," Snow said. "Looking back at all the calls that we have responded to, there is no way to erase the memory of those calls that didn't turn out positive. But I can tell you that because of the efforts of many of you standing here today there have been many homes and lives saved. And because of that I say thank you

on behalf of this community."

Snow also showed off the latest addition to the department's firefighting battery: a crew cab, four-wheel-drive pickup with a 200-gallon tank and 20-gallon foam tank for brush and automobile fires. He said a \$5,000 grant made the truck possible, and thanked county firefighter association President Daniel Day and state President Chauncey Wood for their assistance.

Wood presented Tony Powell and George Snow Sr. with service medals and certificates for 50 years of service to the department, and Chief Snow presented both with plaques and embroidered jackets from the department.

Chuck Murph with the Alabama Department of Homeland Security and state EMA Director Art Faulkner, were on hand and spoke briefly.

The 9/11 steel display was set up inside the station, and is being shown in limited locations before it is placed on permanent display at the Alabama Fire College in Tuscaloosa in June.

The display features a piece of the steel beam that was found on top of Alabama native and member of Rescue 4/FDNY Terry Farrell who was killed in the Sept. 11, 2001 terror attacks at the World Trade Center.

Snow thanked the Monroe County Rescue Squad for transporting the display.

## CERT A NEW ADDITION TO THE PIKE ROAD FIRE DEPARTMENT



The class teaches members looking to be properly trained on how to be prepared for an emergency in Pike Road.

On June 7, the Pike Road Fire Department graduated a new round of volunteers who have been trained to help rescue workers when disaster strikes. A total of twenty-one participates invested a little time and a little effort to be prepared in their community. The Pike Road Fire Department CERT is made up of ladies auxiliary members and affiliates of the Pike Road Fire Department.

The CERT will be reinforcement to the Pike Road Fire Department, Montgomery County EMA and the Montgomery County Sheriff's Department. This devoted, committed and exceptional team of men and women may be activated in the event of a natural disaster, crises or other major event. The team would like to stress to area citizens the importance of getting involved and emergency preparedness.

Woodmen also strives to teach today's youth about the importance of patriotism. We provide schools with an American Patriot's Handbook, which covers historical information, from the U.S. Constitution to the Declaration of Independence to information on every U.S. President up to the current President. Woodmen also teaches the importance of flag care and retirement by participating in a flag retirement ceremony every year at youth camp.

Woodmen of the World will pay a \$10,000 fraternal death benefit if a qualified member is killed while performing his or her duties as a non-military first responder. To be eligible for this benefit, an individual must be a good standing benefit member. First Responders include firefighters, EMT/paramedics, police or a person performing a supporting role to such individuals.

Woodmen of the World has presented U.S. Flags to the Alabama Association of Volunteer Fire Departments since 2008 for a line of duty death, occupational disease and heart

attack death to all fallen firefighters. We have also supplied flags to six regions of the AAVFD Honor Guard.


