

Dear fellow fire fighters,

The first of the new year started on a sad note. Opp fire fighter Jonathan Burgess, age 33, died of a probable heart attack. He was on duty with the Andalusia Airport CFR when he collapsed. I attended the funeral on January 11th. The funeral procession of first responder vehicles (police, fire and EMS) was over a mile long. AAVFD sends our deepest sympathy to his wife and two children.

I forgot to mention in the December issue of the "Volunteer" that Joe Golden had replaced Charles Jackson as Treasurer. I appreciate the knowledge both of these men brought to the AAVFD. We really needed it when a major tax issue came up in February. The issue has now been resolved thanks to the good work of both of these men.

I told members at the Annual Convention in August if I was elected I would serve only one year. I made a commitment in the fall issue of the "Volunteer" to get AAVFD's financial house in order. The later commitment has proved to be far more challenging than I ever imagined. I learned the ropes of being President as I went along. The finances did not get in bad shape in a single year, and I have realized they will not be completely straightened out within a single year. Therefore, I have advised the nominating committee, I would allow my name to be placed in nomination for a second term.

The PFFA sponsored a tag fee bill of \$5.00 for each FF tag sold in the state. This was approved by the Joint Fire Council last year. This is a means to fund the Annuity Bill. There must be some funding to support the Annuity Fund other than member contributions. PFFA President Steve Pegues and AFC Director Allen Rice had the AFC Burn trailer at the Capitol on 02-27-13. I want to thank District Ten Board member Mike Green for attending the legislature that day. I made a couple of rounds thru the State House. A few legislators came out and saw the trailer. We hope to make this a bigger event next year.

As of the date of this letter, the General Fund Budget has passed the Senate and gone to the house. General Fund agencies were level funded. If the House concurs this will mean rural VFD's will receive about the same funding as received this fiscal year. The only difference is the Ala Forestry Commission Steering Committee has recommended that the funds be disbursed with one check instead of two as was the case this year. The funding may be slightly reduced if Tobacco arbitration funds are not received.

By the time you read this letter, AAVFD will have lost Whitney McClelland as our Executive Assistant. She has resigned effective 03-29-2013. She has taken another job closer to home that has a benefits package. I wish her well and will really miss the good work she has done. The AAVFD does not have a benefits package and simply cannot afford one. The filling of Sandy Mott's shoes for the long term may be a difficult task for this Association. I am currently planning to be in Montgomery one full day a week. Corey Carr will be there for a few hours in the morning. This is dependent on his college class schedule. I am putting out feelers to the fire service in the Montgomery metro area for someone in the fire service family who may need a job. This could take a while. If you call the office after 04-01-13 and get the answering machine, please feel free to call my home phone at 334-335-3643. I will return your call sometime within a day or so.

The Next Board meeting is scheduled for 04-20-13 in Wetumpka. The Board has been kept informed of every major issue that has come through the office. The members have been very supportive.

Please check to see if your department or county association has paid their dues. There are about 100 VFDs that have not paid their dues as of the above date.

Be safe, careful, and always remember "everybody goes home" includes you.

"We are looking forward to once again hosting the AAVFD conference and competition this summer at the Alabama Fire College. This is a great opportunity for us to spend time with volunteer firefighters from across our state and allow them to experience the fantastic training facility that we've been provided with here in Alabama. We hope that you will be able to join us for what has become a very exciting event here on campus.

As we all work to meet the challenges facing us due to current economic conditions, it makes me wonder sometimes if we are keeping our priorities in the correct order. Are we continuing to maintain our safety standards, or have we let these slip because the cost seems to be too high? This is a question that we have asked ourselves here at AFC. While it might seem that cutting corners on safety will save money in the short run, the truth is that one accident, injury, or line of duty death can be extremely costly. This is true not only in terms of money, but in terms of pain, suffering, and the death or disability of our fellow firefighters. We encourage each department in Alabama, when funding cuts are necessary, to try to focus on our main priority - our personnel. Even though fuel, equipment, and other things are consuming most of our budgets at this point in time, we have to maintain an emphasis on training, safety, and the well-being of our people.

As always, remember that the regional coordinators are here to assist you with any training needs that you might have. All of our regional coordinators have also been trained to assist a local fire department or county association in the unfortunate event of a line of duty death in your community. For the surviving family of a fallen firefighter, it is critically important that the correct paperwork and procedures are started immediately following the incident so the long-term benefits can be preserved. Although this is not the first thing on everyone's mind when this type of tragedy occurs, it is very necessary for this to happen as quickly as possible for the long-term benefit of the families. Although our regional coordinators will never try to take over the event, they are trained, prepared, and ready to assist you in your department in case the unthinkable happens."

Nicky Kavich (Waterloo VFD) was recognized for more than 5 years of service to the association as a past board member of the LCAVFD. Nicky Kavich was also recognized with a special appreciation plaque for his service and dedication as Fire Prevention Officer for LCAVFD.

For the fifth consecutive year, Municipal Emergency Services (MES) presented the Fire & Life Safety Day Extrication Award to the Underwood-Petersville Volunteer Fire Department.

Thornton Farms, DC Thornton (owner), of Rogersville was recognized as the Small Business Supporter of the Year and Lowe's Home Improvement Warehouse of Florence was recognized as Business Supporter of the Year.

Dwight Bogus (Cloverdale VFD) was presented with the Parking Attendant of the Year award for his involvement with the association's 17th annual parking fundraiser at the North Alabama State Fair.

Steve McEachron, of the Alabama Forestry Commission, presented Zip City VFD with the Smokey Bear Award, which is based on the department's training, fire control, fire prevention, equipment maintenance, and cooperation.

Jim Hulsizer (Mid-Lauderdale VFD) was awarded the Individual Fire Prevention Award. Kim Kavich (Waterloo VFD) was presented with the Ladies Auxiliary Individual of the Year. Terry Whitehorn (Lexington VFD) was presented with the EMS Star of Life Award.

The Fire Chief of the Year award was presented to Fire Chief Wesley Smith (Central VFD) for exceptional contributions over the past year. The "People's Choice Award," also known as the Fire Department of the Year, was awarded to Mid-Lauderdale Volunteer Fire Department. The recipient of this award is selected by the association's general membership each year.

Dylan Springer (Lexington VFD) was named Rookie Firefighter of the Year. A new award category was begun for 2012 for the Explorer of the Year Award. This award is designed to recognize our younger people interested in getting into the fire service. Bubba Pendergrass (Waterloo VFD) was named The Explorer of the Year for 2012.

The final award that was presented was Firefighter of the Year Award. This year's award presentation was extremely

special and emotional for all present. The firefighter awarded the 2012 Firefighter of the Year Award was Mrs. Elizabeth (Beth) Diane Childers, from Anderson VFD. Mrs. Childers gave her life in service to her family and fire department on July 11, 2012 during a structure fire of her own home. Mrs. Childers was handing her child and grandchild out the window of the home when she became trapped in the home when a portion of the home collapsed. Mrs. Childers was recognized as a true hero to her community, fire department, and family for the sacrifice of her life to save that of another. Scott Childers, Beth's husband, was asked to please accept the award on her honor. Beth Childers was named the first female Firefighter of the Year for Lauderdale County.

To honor Beth Childers, and any other county volunteer firefighter who dies in the line of duty, the LCAVFD unveiled a memorial plaque, The Lauderdale County Fallen Fire Fighter Plaque that will be displayed at the courthouse. The association wanted to do something to honor Beth that could be shared and remembered by all those that visit the courthouse.

PROPER LIFTING TECHNIQUES, STRENGTHENING EXERCISES AND BODY AWARENESS CAN HELP PREVENT BACK INJURIES FOR EMTS AND PARAMEDICS

Scene safety is important but more important than scene safety is personal safety. Proper lifting technique and proper exercise are the two best ways to stave off injuries. Low back injuries are the costly and debilitating of all work injuries. In order to lift heavy objects and people safely, one must have an awareness of their body, and the muscles used in movement. To prevent injury, first get yourself as close as possible to the object you are going to lift. Feet should be apart for a stable base. If possible, put your toes under the edges of the gurney or feet as close to the patient as possible. Next tighten your abdominal muscles and keep your back flat. Keep your abs tight and back flat until the lift is complete. As you lift, use the muscles in your legs. Your weight should be in your heels and the balls of your feet. Push up, tighten your hip, leg and buttocks muscles as you rise. Keep the gurney, back board, patient as close to your body as possible and keep your abs tight and back flat. To move the object, move your feet not your waist. Keep your shoulders in the same plane with your hips. Shuffle your feet to keep your base under you rather than twisting your waist. Your back will thank you for your efforts.

Exercise is one way to strengthen and stabilize the trunk. One of the best exercises to strengthen muscles in the trunk is the bicycle abs. It works upper, lower and oblique muscles in the abdomen. We are made to have really strong ab muscles. So exercise daily to prevent back injuries. If you get really sore, take a day or 2 off, and let yourself heal! Very few people injure their abs muscles from over training.





Chester L. Bogus, Underwood-Petersville VFD, Lauderdale County, passed away on Tuesday, March 5, 2013.


